GOJ Sanctions on Russia

The GOJ froze the assets of 25 individuals in executive positions at Russian banks or related to oligarchs. The GOJ also imposed export controls on 81 military-related organizations. Prime Minister Kishida Fumio announced that Japan will provide an additional \$100 million in emergency humanitarian aid to Ukraine and its neighboring countries. Export restrictions on luxury goods are likely to begin next week.

G7 Summit

The G7 leaders met in Brussels on Thursday. The leaders reiterated their support for Ukraine and urged Russia to withdraw its troops. They also discussed measures to prevent Russians from evading sanctions via digital assets and gold. Kishida revealed that the GOJ would be

submitting legislation to revoke Russia's MFN status, as well as to bolster sanctions to prevent evasion via digital assets.

North Korea Launches New ICBM

North Korea launched Hwasong-17, a new ICBM, on Thursday. It landed within Japan's EEZ. The new ICBM represented the longest test for a DPRK ICBM. Reports suggest the GOJ is considering additional sanctions with the U.S. and ROK.

GOJ Issues First Ever Power Supply Warning

On Monday, the GOJ issued its first-ever power supply warning. The warning, established after 3.11, is issued when power usage exceeds 97% of capacity. Reasons include the bad weather impacting renewable sources, and the March 16 earthquake damaging thermal power plants.
