Prime Minister Kishida Fumio met with 42 dignitaries between Tuesday and Thursday on the occasion of former Prime Minister Abe's state funeral.

PM Conducts Funeral Diplomacy

The PM stressed that he would succeed the diplomatic legacy left by Abe. The opposition argued that the results of his diplomatic efforts were "limited" due to the fact none of the G7 leaders attended the funeral.

Kishida did, however, meet with figures including VP Harris, ROK PM Han Duck-soo, Indian PM Narendra Modi and Australian PM Anthony Albanese.

DPRK Conducts 4 Missile Tests

This week, the **DPRK conducted four missile tests**, launching **ICBMs** with irregular trajectories toward Japan. All landed **outside Japan's EEZ**.

They were seen as reactions to VP Harris's visit to Japan and South Korea, as well as the first Japan-U.S.-ROK joint naval exercise since 2017. Japan lodged formal protests to all four.

Four Pillars of Economic Package

On Friday, Kishida instructed his Cabinet to prepare and finalize a comprehensive economic policy package by the end of October.

The package will consist of four pillars: 1) responding to the rising costs of living and raising wages; 2) recovering and bolstering regional economies by utilizing a weak yen; 3) accelerating "new capitalism" by investing in human capital and promoting DX/GX; and 4) securing the safety and security of peoples' livelihoods, including by promoting economic and food security.
