ROK Announces Plan to End Wartime Labor Issue

On Monday, South Korean
Foreign Minister Park Jin
announced that a government
foundation will compensate
wartime labor victims who won
legal cases against Japanese firms
in 2018. It is viewed as a way to
improve bilateral relations.

Foreign Minister Hayashi
Yoshimasa welcomed the
announcement and reaffirmed
past government statements on
history. He stated that the GOJ
will continue to work closely with
the ROK to further advance
relations based on friendly and
cooperative ties.

Prime Minister Kishida Fumio and President Yoon Suk-yeol are expected to meet in Japan when the latter visits on March 16-17. A recent poll showed 59 percent of South Koreans opposed the plan.

<u>Internal Documents Scandal Hits</u> Kishida Cabinet

Minister in charge of Economic Security **Takaichi Sanae** has come under fire after documents from 2015 revealed that then-MIC Minister Takaichi may have been impartial in her interpretation of the Broadcast Act.

A document showed that she had questioned the interpretation of the Act in a phone call with then-Prime Minister Abe Shinzo. She stressed that the documents were "fabricated" and rejected demands to resign.

New BOJ Governor Confirmed

On Friday, the Upper House followed the Lower House in approving **Ueda Kazuo, Uchida Shinichi, and Hlmino Ryozo** for BOJ governor and vice governor. The new leadership will take office on **April 9**.
