THIS WEEK IN NUMBERS

JSDF Officer Kills Instructors

On Wednesday, the **police arrested an 18-year-old JSDF officer** after he shot a rifle, **killing two instructors and injuring a third** at a military firing range in Gifu. He was referred to prosecutors on Thursday on **suspicion of murder**.

This was the **first fatal shooting incident** at a JGSDF firing range since 1984. The officer claimed that **he never intended to fatally wound** the 52-year-old instructor he was targeting.

PM Rules Out HoR Dissolution

On Thursday, **Prime Minister Kishida Fumio ruled out** the dissolution of the Lower House to call a snap election.

Reports suggest that 1) **he lost justification** to call an election after the Diet enacted key legislation; 2) **rift with Komeito**

impacted election prospects; and 3) **political scandals** involving his son and the My Number Card led to declining approval rating.

GOJ Presents 25 Sensitive Tech Fields for Patent Protection

On Monday, the GOJ presented a draft plan for **patent protection** at a panel meeting on the economic security promotion law.

The GOJ designated **25 fields** — inventions highly likely to **harm the security of the nation and its people** or those that **impact economic activity or innovation** — including technologies related to aircraft stealth equipment and hypersonics. Of those, **ten** will only be protected if for **defense or commissioned by the GOJ**.

The GOJ aims to implement the measures **around spring 2024**, after crafting an ordinance over the summer.
