## PM Deepens Security Ties in Europe

On Wednesday, Prime Minister Kishida Fumio delivered a speech welcoming increasing Euro-Atlantic involvement in the Indo-Pacific at the NATO Summit meeting being held in Vilnius, Lithuania.

Prior to the Summit, Kishida held a meeting with **NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg** and adopted the **new ITPP outlining security cooperation** in sixteen areas over the next four years.

Following the Summit, Kishida held a leaders' meeting with **European Council President Charles Michel** and **European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen** and agreed to establish a **strategic dialogue** at the foreign ministerial level. The EU will also **lift import restrictions** on Japanese food.

## LDP Tax Commission Hints Defense Tax Hike Delay

On Thursday, Chairperson Miyazawa Yoichi of the LDP Research Commission on the Tax System said the commission confirmed that it would be **"impossible"** to raise the **corporate tax in FY 2024** to finance increased defense spending.

The commission came to the conclusion that it would be **extremely difficult to prepare legislation** for the corporate tax hike for the extraordinary Diet session this fall.

There are elements of the LDP that **oppose a tax hike** and want to exhaust all other options before raising tax rates. Reports suggest this was fueled by news of **high tax revenue in FY 2022**, which reached a record-high **¥71.1 trillion**.
