Japan-U.S.-ROK Trilateral Summit

On August 18, Prime Minister Kishida Fumio met with U.S. President Joe Biden and South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol at Camp David for a **historic summit marking the first standalone summit** between the three leaders.

The three leaders stated their commitment to the **complete denuclearization of the DPRK**, the importance of **peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait**, their commitment to **consult each other** to respond to regional challenges, the establishment of **regular trilateral communications and multi-domain exercises**, a **new trilateral working group** to drive cooperation on the DPRK, and a commitment to launch an **early warning system** to respond to global supply chain issues.

Japan Begins Release of Treated Radioactive Water from Fukushima Plant

On Tuesday, the **Cabinet approved** the plan to begin releasing ALPS-treated radioactive water from the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant on **August 24**.

The GOJ and TEPCO plan to **release water over the next thirty years**. TEPCO and the IAEA both confirmed the initial release had **no issues**.

In response to the release, **China announced a blanket ban on seafood imports from Japan**. Kishida stated that the GOJ requested that the **ban be withdrawn**.

The GOJ plans to **expand subsidies** to seafood processing companies to combat such bans. The **current JPY 80 billion fund** does not cover processing companies.
