<u>Chinese Military Aircraft</u> <u>Violates Japanese Airspace for</u> First Time

On Monday, the Ministry of Defense (MOD) confirmed that a Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) reconnaissance aircraft "Y-9" violated Japanese territorial airspace for three minutes off the coast of Danjo Islands, Nagasaki.

This was the **first time** a PLA aircraft violated Japanese territorial airspace. The MOD has confirmed **forty-six violations** in the past, two of which two were Chinese cases.

The PLA has been actively expanding its activities around Japan, routinely sending vessels around the Senkaku Islands and deploying aircraft carriers to the area that the Y-9 was spotted in.

The GOJ issued a "severe protest" concerning the incident, with Chief Cabinet Secretary Hayashi Yoshimasa calling it a "serious violation of sovereignty." Beijing claimed the incident was "unintentional."

<u>Candidates Continue Announcing</u> <u>Bids for LDP Presidency</u>

On Monday, **Digital Minister Kono Taro became the third Diet member**to formally announce his candidacy
for the LDP presidency. Kono
emphasized his record as a **reform- minded politician** and pledged to
build up the middle class.

Kono has been a divisive figure in the LDP — supported by Diet members with fewer terms in office who view him as a "maverick," while veterans view him as a liability for being outspoken and not honoring tradition.

A boon to his campaign will be LDP Vice President Aso Taro's endorsement, though Aso's faction will be allowed to vote for other candidates running in the race.

The LDP presidential election on September 27 is shaping up to be one of the most consequential elections in recent history, with a likely record number of candidates gunning to become the next leader of Japan.
